(Department of Homeland Security (DHS) allows these documents to be photocopied for verification of citizenship.)

- ELIGIBLE NON-CITIZEN - I am an eligible non-citizen and am providing one of the following documents from the DHS:**
 - Lawful permanent resident.** You must provide an I-551 Permanent Resident Card or Resident Alien Card. (Front and back of card.) **OR** I-94 Arrival/Departure Record stamped with "Processed for I-551 with expiration date or "Temporary Form I-551" with appropriate information filled in. **OR** Machine Readable Immigrant VISA (MRIV) stamped with "Upon endorsement serves as temporary I-551 evidencing permanent residence for one year."
 - Battered immigrant — qualified alien (i.e., Violence Against Women Act)** I-797 Approval Notice stating it is an "approval notice for a self-petitioning case." **OR** A letter from USCIS that says "determined as prima facie." **OR** Court order from an immigration judge must not be expired and clearly indicates "suspension of deportation under VAWA." **OR** Court order from an immigration judge must not be expired and clearly indicates "cancellation of removal under VAWA."
 - Other eligible non-citizen** - Provide an I-94 stamped as one of the following:
 (a) "Refugee," (b) "Asylum Granted," (c) Individual Paroled into the U.S. for at least one year
 (d) "Cuban-Haitian Entrant" **OR** (e) Victims of Human trafficking (T-visa) I-94 Arrival/Departure Record with codes T1, T2, T3 or TCOA **with** an Eligibility Letter from the Department of Health and Human Services
 - Citizen of the Freely Associated States (Federated States of Micronesia, Republic of the Marshall Islands and Republic of Palau)** You must provide a Passport from the Freely Associated States **OR** I-94 Arrival/Departure Record stamped with codes CFA/FSM, CFA/MIS or CFA/PAL

NOTE: You are **INELIGIBLE** to receive federal student aid if you are any one of the following:

- An applicant for permanent resident status not in a category listed above.
- A student with an F1 or F2, M-1 (student visa), J1 or J2 (exchange visitor) or H, L or G series Visa.
- A student in the United States with only an Employment Verification
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status

Be sure to **include both sides** of the document you are sending (make sure copies are legible).
